At Marton Primary Academy and Nursery, the safety of our children, staff and pupils is paramount in everything we do. We will endeavour to do our very best to ensure that children are supported emotionally and academically in the event of them having to self-isolate.

In the event of a child having to self-isolate, either because they have Covid-19 symptoms and are awaiting a test or one of their family members has symptoms and is awaiting a test, or they have been notified as being a close contact, we will ensure the following:

- Class teachers will make regular contact with the child's family.
- Class teachers will set work appropriate for the child's ability and will send home any passwords for our intervention programmes such as Lexia, IDL and TT Rockstars.
Children with Special Educational Needs will be provided with bespoke work which will be overseen by our Deputy Inclusion Lead, Mrs Holden.
- School will provide all of the resources needed for the child to complete their work.
- Food will be provided for any children entitled to free school meals.

In the event of a group of children having to self-isolate following guidance from Public Health due to a positive Covid-19 case, we will ensure the following:

- Class teachers and teaching assistants will make regular contact with each family.
- Ensure that all children have access to high quality remote education resources.
- Ensure that our children who usually access our bespoke SEND provision continue to access this provision.
- Plan a programme equivalent in length to the core teaching our children receive in school.
- Provide all of the resources that the children need and printed resources for any children who do not have suitable online access.

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- Loan a laptop to families who informed school that they do not have an appropriate device at home, once the loan agreement has been completed.
- Provide live lessons through Microsoft teams.
- Teach the children how to keep safe on the internet prior to them self-isolating.
- Provide regular feedback for the children.
- Provide food vouchers for children who are entitled to free school meals.

We ask that parents ensure the following:

- Ensure school always has your most up-to-date contact details.
- School is notified if your child does not have access at home to a computer or i-pad or does not have access to the internet if you have not already done so.
- The loan agreement is completed for any equipment school which is loaned to you.
- Ensure your child has a safe, quiet place to work.
- Ensure Microsoft Teams is downloaded on to your child's device to enable them to access live lessons.
- Ensure your child is dressed and ready to start learning for 9:00 a.m.
- Ensure other family members are dressed appropriately if accessing the same room while your child is using Teams.
- Ensure personal information is out of camera shot e.g address, bank details.
- Report any concerns about your child's learning at home to school.
- Read and adhere to the Covid -19 appendix to the BFET e-learning policy.

We ask that children ensure the following:

- Use the conduct expected in school when attending live lessons.
- Complete all work to the best of their ability.
- Tell an adult if they do not have the appropriate resources or if they need clarification on a task.
- Follow our internet safety rules as in the Covid-19 appendix to the BFET E-Learning Policy.



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
